



# GHRCEM, Jalgaon Organised "Samuh" A Group Discussion Event

Students were divided into groups randomly and discussed topics related to management, economy, and society under the supervision of faculty judges. The

evaluation was based on parameters such as clarity of thought, logical reasoning, communication skills, leadership, and teamwork.

The activity was coordinated by Prof. Tanmay Bhale, who guided the students throughout the event. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation, reflecting students' eagerness to engage in collaborative and intellectual discourse.

### **Outcomes of the Activity**

Overview of the Smart India Hackathon Initiated in 2017 under the vision of Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the Smart India Hackathon (SIH) aims to promote innovation among the youth and solve various problems through technology. This nationwide initiative provides a platform for students to address critical issues faced by society, institutions, and the government. Recognized as the world's largest innovation platform, the competition seeks to foster a culture of innovation, effective problem-solving, and creativity in product development among students.

Structure of the Competition: In the first round, various ministries of the Government of India, including Agriculture, Education, Tourism, Textiles, Commerce and Industry, Defense,







Finance, Health and Family Welfare, Home Affairs, and Information and Broadcasting, publish real-world problems on the Smart India Hackathon portal. Students submit creative, sustainable, and socially inclusive solutions to these problems.

Idea Submission Process: Only 500 ideas are accepted in the preliminary round, and the submitted ideas are evaluated by experts based on innovation, long-term impact, user experience, potential for excellence, complexity, feasibility, and sustainability. After evaluation, approximately 4 to 5 teams are selected for each problem statement to compete in the grand finale.

### **30-Hour Programming Competition:**

- The competition is a continuous 30-hour computer programming event.
- Developers and programmers from across the country are invited as judges.
- Due to time constraints, many student teams work on their projects day and night.

 The event provides students an opportunity to focus deeply on a subject and encourages creative thinking about innovations.

Through this process, innovative, technical, and practical solutions are developed for various national challenges, allowing students to demonstrate their skills on a national stage.

Attractive Prizes in the National Hackathon: In the final round of the national hackathon, teams presenting the best and most socially beneficial solutions receive attractive cash prizes as follows:

- First Prize: ₹1,00,000 (One Lakh Rupees)
- Second Prize: ₹75,000 (Seventy-Five Thousand Rupees)
- Third Prize: ₹50,000 (Fifty Thousand Rupees)

These prizes inspire students to develop new ideas and innovative projects while fostering the growth of their technical skills.

### GHRCEM, Jalgaon Organised Yuvarang Youth Festival 2025 Showcases Vibrant Talent

# GHRCL, Nagpur Student's Educational Visit to Central Jail, Nagpur

As part of the practical learning component of the LL.B. curriculum, the students of G H Raisoni Law College, Nagpur visited the Central Jail, Nagpur, on 16th October 2025. The purpose of this educational visit was to provide students with an insight into the functioning of the prison system, its administrative structure, and the rehabilitation measures adopted for inmates. The visit was organized under the guidance of the Department of Law and coordinated by the faculty members, with a total of 41 students (25 girls and 16 boys) participating.

#### **Objectives of the Visit**

To understand the organizational structure and working of the prison system.

- To study the rights and living conditions of prisoners.
- To observe the implementation of correctional and rehabilitation programs.
- To bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical exposure.
- To analyse the role of the judiciary and legal aid mechanisms within the prison system.

The Central Jail, Nagpur, is one of the largest & oldest prisons in Maharashtra, accommodating both male and female inmates, including undertrial and convicted prisoners. The jail operates under the supervision of the Superintendent of Police (Jail Department) and adheres to the Maharashtra Prisons Rules, 1970 & Prison Act, 1894.

### The facility includes:

- Separate barracks for men and women.
- Vocational training units (such as carpentry, tailoring, and handicrafts).
- An internal health centre & educational wing.
- Library and legal aid cell.
- Kitchen and sanitation departments maintained by inmates under supervision.

#### **Activities and Interactions**

Upon arrival, students were briefed by the Jail Superintendent and senior officials about the history, structure, and daily routine of the inmates. The officials also explained the security measures, rehabilitation initiatives, and legal aid facilities available to prisoners.

### **Key interactions included:**

- session with the Jail Welfare Officer, who discussed rehabilitation programs, including skill development workshops and literacy drives.
- Observation of prison industries where inmates are trained in tailoring, paper bag making, and bakery to promote self-reliance.
- A visit to the prison library and educational section, where inmates engage in reading and distance education programs.
- A short discussion with the legal aid cell staff, emphasizing the significance of access to justice for under-trial prisoners.

Students were allowed to observe but not photograph the premises due to security restrictions.

#### **Key Learnings and Observations**

I The prison administration focuses not only on security and discipline but also on reformation and rehabilitation.

- Inmates are encouraged to participate in educational and vocational activities for personal growth and reintegration into society.
- Psychological counselling and religious/spiritual sessions are part of weekly programs to support mental well-being.
- The visit helped students understand prison laws, human rights aspects, and the challenges faced by prison authorities.
- Students realized the crucial role of legal aid clinics and public defenders in ensuring justice for prisoners.

#### Students' Feedback

Students expressed that the visit provided valuable real-world exposure and deepened their understanding of:

- Criminal justice system functioning beyond courtrooms.
- The practical implications of legal provisions under the Prison Act and CrPC.
- The importance of humanitarian and reformative approaches in criminal law.

They appreciated the professionalism and cooperation of jail authorities during the visit.

The visit to Central Jail, Nagpur, was an enlightening and educational experience for the final-year law students of G H Raisoni Law College, Nagpur. It successfully connected classroom learning with field realities, emphasizing the reformative and rehabilitative philosophy of modern penology. 
# GHRCE, Nagpur Celebrates Successful AWS Skill Certification of Students & Faculty




## GHRCE, Nagpur Celebrates Successful AWS Skill Certification of Students & Faculty


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The initiative was spearheaded by Dr. Girish Talmale, Dr. Atiya Khan, Prof. Mrunali Dhone, and

## **Industrial Visits**

## GHRCL, Nagpur Student's Educational Visit to Central Jail, Nagpur

As part of the practical learning component of the LL.B. curriculum, the students of G H Raisoni Law College, Nagpur visited the Central Jail, Nagpur, on 16th October 2025. The purpose of this educational visit was to provide students with an insight into the functioning of the prison system, its administrative structure, and the rehabilitation measures adopted for inmates. The visit was organized under the

guidance of the Department of Law and coordinated by the faculty members, with a total of 41 students (25 girls and 16 boys) participating.

#### **Objectives of the Visit**

To understand the organizational structure and working of the prison system.

To study the rights and living conditions of prisoners.

- To observe the implementation of correctional and rehabilitation programs.
- To bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical exposure.
- To analyse the role of the judiciary and legal aid mechanisms within the prison system.

The Central Jail, Nagpur, is one of the largest and oldest prisons in Maharashtra, accommodating both male and female inmates, including under-trial and convicted prisoners. The jail operates under the supervision of the Superintendent of Police (Jail Department) and adheres to the Maharashtra Prisons Rules, 1970 and Prison Act, 1894.

#### The facility includes:

- Separate barracks for men and women.
- Vocational training units (such as carpentry, tailoring, and handicrafts).
- An internal health centre and educational wing.
- Library and legal aid cell.
- Kitchen and sanitation departments maintained by inmates under supervision.

#### **Activities and Interactions**

Upon arrival, students were briefed by the Jail Superintendent and senior officials about the history, structure, and daily routine of the inmates. The officials also explained the security measures, rehabilitation initiatives, and legal aid facilities available to prisoners.

#### Key interactions included:

- Session with the Jail Welfare Officer, who discussed rehabilitation programs, including skill development workshops and literacy drives.
- Observation of prison industries where inmates are trained in tailoring, paper bag

- making, and bakery to promote self-reliance.
- A visit to the prison library and educational section, where inmates engage in reading and distance education programs.
- A short discussion with the legal aid cell staff, emphasizing the significance of access to justice for under-trial prisoners.

Students were allowed to observe but not photograph the premises due to security restrictions.

#### **Key Learnings and Observations**

- The prison administration focuses not only on security and discipline but also on reformation and rehabilitation.
- Inmates are encouraged to participate in educational and vocational activities for personal growth and reintegration into society.
- Psychological counselling and religious/spiritual sessions are part of weekly programs to support mental well-being.
- The visit helped students understand prison laws, human rights aspects, and the challenges faced by prison authorities.
- Students realized the crucial role of legal aid clinics and public defenders in ensuring justice for prisoners.

#### Students' Feedback

Students expressed that the visit provided valuable real-world exposure and deepened their understanding of:

- Criminal justice system functioning beyond courtrooms.
- The practical implications of legal provisions under the Prison Act and CrPC.
- The importance of humanitarian and reformative approaches in criminal law.

They appreciated the professionalism and cooperation of jail authorities during the visit.

The visit to Central Jail, Nagpur, was an enlightening and educational experience for the final-year law students of G H Raisoni Law College, Nagpur. It successfully connected classroom learning with field realities,



emphasizing the reformative and rehabilitative philosophy of modern penology. #### **Legal Insights and Observations:**

- 1. Study of Reformative Approach in the Justice System
- The prison administration emphasized reformation and rehabilitation processes.

- The segregation of convicts and under trials, along with basic facilities and disciplined management, was observed to align with human rights provisions under Section 21 of the Indian Penal Code.
- 2. Implementation of Human Rights
- Regular health check-ups, medical facilities, and nutritious food supply were noted to comply with the Human Rights Act, 1993, ensuring the protection of prisoners' rights.
- The administration was proactive in maintaining hygiene, health, and mental well-being.
- 3. Rehabilitation and Vocational Training Programs
- Skill development initiatives such as tailoring, carpentry, and literacy campaigns

- reflected rehabilitation efforts under Article 21 of the Indian Constitution (Right to Life and Personal Liberty).
- Emphasis was placed on social rehabilitation to reduce recidivism.

#### 4. Security and Surveillance Systems

- 24/7 monitoring through CCTV ensured administrative transparency and security in line with the Prison Act, 1894.
- A balance was maintained between discipline and security while regulating prisoners' movements.

## Importance of Practical Experience in Education

 Students noted that the visit provided an opportunity to understand the gap between theoretical criminal justice taught in classrooms and its practical implementation in prison management. The visit offered practical insights into the Indian Penal Code (IPC), Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC), and Prison Manuals.



The role of continuous ambient air quality monitoring stations in environmental planning and control was explained in detail. This exposure highlighted the importance of reducing dependency on fossil fuels through sustainable alternatives. The group also visited NEERI's Green Building, which demonstrated eco-friendly design and construction practices. Features such as natural lighting, rainwater

harvesting, thermal insulation, solar passive architecture, and efficient HVAC systems were showcased as practical approaches for minimizing energy consumption and reducing carbon footprint. Finally, the Up Flow Compact Constructed Wetland was observed as a lowcost, eco-friendly wastewater treatment technology.
